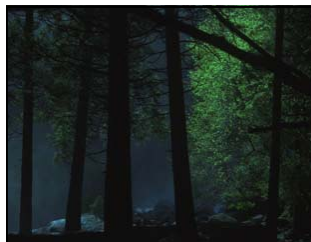

Each Sunday afternoon mid-June to mid-October the buildings are open for public viewing. Costumed docents are on hand to inform visitors about the buildings, their contents, and about Northville's past. Many weekends, a working blacksmith demonstrates the craft, weavers and rug hookers ply their trades, and an occasional strolling musician may be found. Special events are planned for July 4th and the Victorian Festival.

To the uninitiated, the historic Village is a nineteenth-century jewel in Northville's crown. Seven buildings, ranging from approximately 1831 to the 1890's, have carefully been moved from various parts of Northville to the scenic park land on Griswold Street; two more have been meticulously reconstructed with the aid of period photographs and plans.



A visit to the Village is a delightful way to explore the past, take a pleasant stroll, and step back in time. Mill Race Village is open to all, and there is no admission charge. It's located on Griswold, just east of Downtown Northville, between Main Street and Eight Mile Road. The grounds are open daily from sunrise to sunset; the buildings are open on Sunday afternoons.

PLP was created to provide alternatives for garden plastic not recycled curbside in our community and promote environmental education in our schools and local organizations. We offer simple solutions for reducing, reusing and recycling, which results in a cleaner and healthier planet.

The first objective is to empower children to be stewards for the earth. PLP offers fun, interactive outreach programs designed to help students and community groups develop environmentally sound habits. By incorporating simple steps in one's life, we can significantly reduce our carbon footprint and live a sustainable life.

PLP also strives to prevent hundreds of thousands of pounds of garden plastic from entering our Michigan landfills. Americans spend \$10 billion each year on plants, most of which are packaged in plastic pots and trays that are not recycled curbside. An unfortunate and fundamentally flawed consequence of this massive beautification effort is the accumulation of non-biodegradable plastic in the earth.

In the spring of 2008, PLP launched a flower pot/tray collection at the **Northville Farmers' Market**, giving gardeners an alternative for plastic pot and tray disposal. Thanks to community participation, PLP collected over 500 pounds of plastic. Half was returned to appreciative farmers for reuse ~ the ultimate goal in recycling! PLP is expanding plastic flower pot/tray collection sites in 2009 to 4 garden Centers, the Farmington Farmers' Market and a wholesale plant center in hopes of recovering plastic containers consumed by landscapers. By recovering, reusing and recycling this plastic we will reduce petroleum consumption and preserve earth's precious



nonrenewable resources. This is sustainability in its truest sense.

In order to support this endeavor, the president, Gina Adams-Levy, makes garden art flowers out of recycled flower pots. These are whimsical, colorful flowers that add fun to any garden. You can find them for sale at **Starring The Gallery** in Downtown

Northville through June. A portion of the proceeds will also be donated to the Northville-Novu Branch of American Association of University Women (AAUW).
